W.H.O. Foundation Volunteer Service Grant Awards \$38,750 to El Hogar Albergue para Niños Jesús de Nazaret

Mayaguez, PR — El Hogar Albergue para Niños Jesús de Nazaret, Inc, a local charitable organization that provides shelter and care to children who are victims of family violence has been awarded a Volunteer Service Grant in the amount of \$38,750 from the W.H.O. (Women Helping Others®) Foundation.

A check presentation will take place on Sunday October 9th during the BeautiControl® Training Event at the San Juan Convention Center with BeautiControl Independent Senior Director Anael Ramirez Camacho in attendance.

After volunteering there for more than four years, Anael Ramirez Camacho submitted Hogar Jesús de Nazaret to W.H.O. for consideration for the Volunteer Service Grant. She said. “I was overwhelmed, it felt like it was a blessing from God. Thanks to BeautiControl and W.H.O. we are able to give back in some small way to help the children who most need a better quality of life, love and affection.”

She added, “The people at the home work hard day and night, sometimes without pay, to help these poor children. This grant is very important in helping Hogar Jesús to Nazaret continue giving service to the children in West Puerto Rico.”

Lisette Ortiz, Executive Director for El Hogar said, “It was with great emotion when Anael called me late one night. I cried with joy and called one of my partners to share the good news. With the grant from the W.H.O. Foundation we will be able to give these children a better quality of life and shelter them from abusive homes.”

The grant will help fund the remodeling of La Casita Blanca, as well as purchase new playground equipment, computers, bunk beds and mattresses. “The Hogar de Nazaret also needs more volunteers to spend time with these children reading stories and playing them,” added Ortiz.

The W.H.O. Volunteer Service Grant was established as a way to recognize those BeautiControl Independent Consultants for outstanding volunteer service in their community.
